*Billy & I were among 25 first cousins in the Radney family! Several of us grew up in Dallas & have good memories of playing ball, red rover & other games in his parents' huge yard that sat back on Bruton Road. Billy's sister, Vivian, & I were very close as the 3 of us attended Samuell High School together. My brother Larry, slightly younger than us, was quite close to Billy. Our dads, less than 2 years apart, were also very close. In addition, our parents shared a common wedding anniversary. It's interesting that 2 ladies commented about dancing the two-step & waltz with Billy. On one of our parents common anniversaries, they went out to dinner together. Billy & his sister and I & my brother were teenagers and we remained home. We entertained ourselves that evening with Larry & Vivian dancing together and Billy & I dancing together! Ladies, I'm sorry I didn't teach Billy very well, but I probably didn't know any more about dancing, than Billy did. Plus, dances like "the twist" were popular in the '60s. We sadly attended Billy's funeral. \*But our consolation was the knowledge that he had accepted Jesus as his personal savior while attending the Baptist Church next door to his family home on Bruton Road in Dallas.\* Death is never the end of life. But accepting Jesus prior to death, determines WHERE we will spend eternity. I'm writing this during the Christmas season, 2025. That is the reason God's Son was born in a manger over 2,000 years ago. After sin began in the garden of Eden, all of us born thereafter are born with a sin nature, Except for Christ Jesus.
