Carmen was confident Heaven awaited because she believed God is the ultimate Healer and the only way to be saved from our sins. A Robert E. Lee High School class of 1982 graduate, Carmen went on to earn her Bachelor's at Baylor University in Waco in 1986. She was a member of the
