CJ Cavanaugh, Jr. was born Sept.3, 1941 in Mineola New York.

No, he was not a Yankee, since his Father, Charley & Mother Eloise Gill Cavanaugh were both from Leesville, La.

Moving to New Orleans 1943 he remembers walking beside the German Prison Camp near his home by Lake Pontchartrain. His Navy cousin Willie came ashore & gave him an out of style Navy dress cap. In 1944-45 on his grandfather's farm near Camp Polk (at that time) he would draw buckets of water for the soldiers on maneuvers along the dirt road. One soldier gave him an army dress cap as thanks for the water.

Little did CJ know those two caps were a harbinger for he would be in the Army & even stationed at (now called) Fort Polk. Then finish his military time in the Navy at Naval Air Station, Dallas Texas. CJ always said that God was taking good care of him.

In Dallas, CJ met the most beautiful girl in his world, Bonita Davis. They were married in 1966. Bonnie worked as secretary to the chief inspector of the Food & Drug Administration. She put him through his Masters degree in Art. They moved to Tyler & he taught art at TJC for 45 years.

They have a son, Charles Davis Cavanaugh PhD computer science.

CJ and his wife Bonnie have Creative Design, sign & mural business. The welcome to Tyler signs are their creations. Their sign for Rose Capital Bank won 2nd place national 1972 sign design. Their murals are in schools & businesses across Texas.

CJ was the oldest of five brothers in his family. He will be buried in his and his wife's crypt in Bascom Cemetery near Tyler.

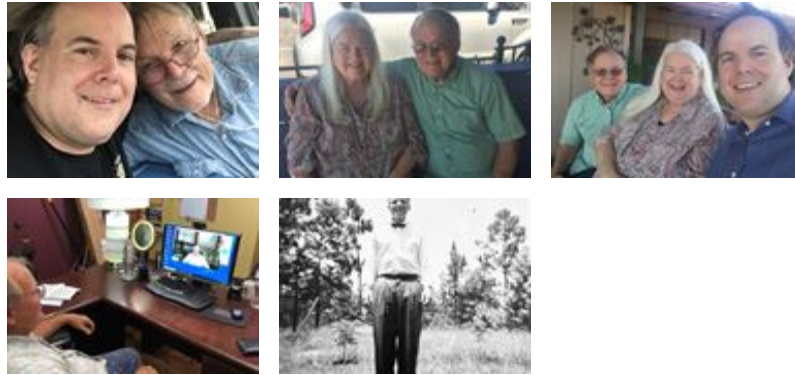
