Mr. Clarence Dean Knight, age 84, died Tuesday, January 11, 2005 at Mother Francis Hospital in Tyler, Texas. He was also known as C.D. and Dean and Papaw to his family and friends.

Mr. Knight was a World War II veteran and served in the Army Air Force. After WWII, Mr. Knight returned and became a butcher in his community and then joined American Airlines where he retired almost thirty years ago.
