Daisy Staples Johnson went to be with her Lord and Savior on Thursday May 6, 2010, and to be reunited with the love of her life and husband of 58 years, John L. "Jack" Johnson. She was born on September 25, 1916 to Searcy Vernon & Annie Roye Staples on the Staples family plantation southwest of Lindale, Smith County, Texas. Services are scheduled for 11:00 A.M. on Saturday, May 8, 2010 in the Caudle-Rutledge Funeral Home Chapel in Lindale with Rev. James Cheatham and OES officiating. Interment will follow in the Hopewell Cemetery. She was preceded in death by the afore mentioned parents and beloved husband, 2 brothers, Glenn Staples, Roy Staples and sister, Hazel Neal. Mrs. Johnson moved from Lindale to Swan at the age of 12, and remained there for the next 68 years moving to Tyler in 1996 until her death.
