



## Day Cameron

Funeral services for Day Cameron age 88 of Hideaway are scheduled for 2:00 PM Saturday, May 8, 2010 at the Covington United Methodist Church in Covington, Texas with Eddie Carrell officiating. Interment will follow at 4:30 PM in the Fall Creek Cemetery near Acton under the direction of Caudle-Rutledge Funeral Directors of Lindale.

Mr. Cameron was born April 21, 1922 in Yowell, Texas the son of the late Justus Brown and Nannie Belle (Day) Cameron. He passed away Tuesday, May 4, 2010 at his residence in Hideaway. Mr. Cameron lived in Covington from 1961 to 2007. He and his wife owned Cameron Grocery until 1989. He was a member of Covington United Methodist Church, where he taught men's Sunday school for over 20 years, and was a member of the Covington Volunteer Fire Department. Mr. Cameron was a veteran of World War II serving in the United States Navy. After moving to Hideaway, Mr. Cameron was a member of the First United Methodist Church Lindale. Mr. Cameron was a graduate of East Texas State Teachers College and attended TCU receiving a commission in the U.S. Navy. He served in the Pacific Theater commanding a LCT at the time of General MacArthur's return to the Philippines.

Mr. Cameron is survived by his wife Eudora Cameron of Hideaway; son, Jerald Cameron and wife Cathy of Hideaway; brother, Dr. Harold Cameron

and wife Eleanor of Tyler; grandchildren, John Robert Gaumnitz and Meg Sykes, and a great grandson, John Grady Gaumntiz.
