



Gary Lynn Roye

October 8, 1949 - July 15, 2022

A graveside memorial service for Gary Lynn Roye, age 72 of Howardwick, Texas, is scheduled for 10:00 a.m. Friday, July 29, 2022, at Hopewell Cemetery in Lindale, Texas with Dr. James Pierce officiating.

Gary passed away Friday, July 15, 2022, in Amarillo, Texas. He was born October 8, 1949, in Longview, Texas to the late S.W. Roye Jr. and Vivian Joyce (Wood) Roye Jackson and Doyle Jackson. Gary was a longtime resident of Howardwick where he was a member of the First Baptist Church and was previously of Dalhart and Tyler, Texas. He was an all-state first baseman on the John Tyler Highschool state ranked baseball team where he graduated in 1968, continuing on in college baseball in Oklahoma, and soon thereafter began his 27-year railroad career retiring as a Train Engineer with Union Pacific. He also enjoyed the outdoors, horses, sports, and hunting. Gary was preceded in death by his son, Adam Roye and sister, Kay (Roye) Garrett.

He is survived by sons, Brad Roye and wife, Martha of Longview, Texas, Jake Roye and wife, Shani of China Spring, Texas, and Cody Roye of Amarillo, Texas; 12 grandchildren; 1 great grandchild; brother, Stanley Roye of Commerce, Texas; and numerous other loving family members and friends. 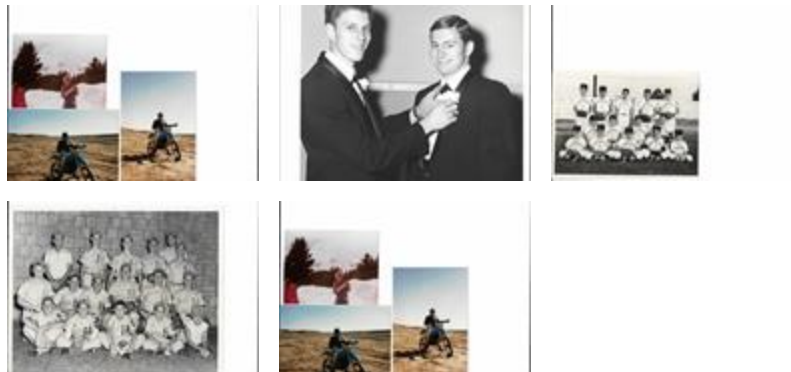
