Mr. Granberry returned to the Tyler area in 1981 after retiring from the military, and was a member of the First Baptist Church of Winona. He was a retired Major in the United States Army serving 2 tours in Vietnam where he was awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross and the Bronze Star. He was a member of the Vietnam Helicopter Pilots Association. After retiring from the Army, he flew helicopters for Petroleum Helicopters Inc serving the off shore oil industry. Later he became part owner of Brothers Manufacturing in Winona. Glenn was a devoted husband and adoring father. Mr. Granberry was preceded in death by his parents, brothers, George "Buddy" Granberry, Henry "Cotton" Granberry and sisters, Lillian Vickers and Marie Morris.
