Services for Mr. H. B. "Walt" Walton, age 86, of Mineola and formerly of Hideaway are scheduled for 2:00 P.M. Sunday in the Caudle-Rutledge Funeral Home Chapel in Lindale with Bro. James Wheat officiating. Mr. Walton died Thursday, November 17, 2005. He was born August 5, 1919 in Pinehurst, Georgia. After graduation from high school in 1937, he enrolled at Carson-Newman College in Jefferson City, Tennessee. He was graduated in 1941 with a B. S. Degree in Business Administration. He joined the Army Air Corp in December 1941 and was discharged in 1945 following a 3 year stint with the 9th Air Force in England and Europe. From 1945 to 1948 he worked as a math teacher and coach at Vienna High School in Vienna, Georgia. From 1948 to 1953 he worked for Dunn and Bradstreet in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma and Kansas City, Missouri. In August 1953 he joined Norwich Easton Pharmaceuticals as a sales rep in Macon, Georgia. In 1956, he was promoted to District Sales Manager, with headquarters in Dallas. He was subsequently promoted to Regional Sales Manager and remained in this capacity until retirement in August 1988. He continued working after retirement as a Consultant developing National Accounts for Proctor & Gamble Pharmaceuticals. He was preceded in death by his first Wife, Fern Walton and a Son Robert "Bob" Walton. Mr. Walton was formerly of Dallas and lived at Hideaway for 12 years before moving to Mineola 4 years ago. He was a member of the Royal Haven Baptist Church in Dallas.

He is survived by his Wife, Mrs. Geneva Walton of Mineola; Son and Daughter-in-law, John and Karen Walton of Mt. Vernon; Step Children, Barry Head of Texarkana, Arkansas, Lamar Hughes of Mineola and Nita Joe Thompson of Mineola; Granddaughters, Jamie Roberts and Michelle Barba both of Dallas; Grandson, Ryan Walton; and Great-Granddaughter, Maddison Barba.
