“ The shenanigans of Jo and Cindy~~~ We met in third grade and I remember so many fun things that happened when she moved into the neighborhood. How did they get all of those kids into such a tiny house? Back then my grandmother said we lived on silk stocking row but now I think those houses would fit in my den and kitchen. My first memory was chasing down the mailman begging to give me Jo's card with her teacher on it. One mailman just looked and said "YES" which meant we were in the same room. Bless those teachers hearts. We could just look at each other across the room and bust a gut laughing! I remember us chasing the misquito sprayer trucks down the Van Hwy playing in that nice cool mist! That happened a lot. We drank from water hose too and did all the things together kids do. trick-or-treating, talking on the phone for hours etc. Here are a few of those memories...

We were not old enough to cross Bow street but if either had to go to Lasater's for milk or bread and sign the charge book for 57c, the other would go along. By 5th grade it was to check out the new sackers. When President Kennedy was killed, I remember Jo hugging me on the playground because Gov. Connally was also shot. Even though I didn't know him, he was a cousin of Daddy's and she worried about me.

There was a storm drain about half way between the two houses we lived in and if she stayed at one house we'd walk to the storm drain together, turn around and run as fast as we could past the 3 houses to get home. Then we waved that old man Brown hadn't grabbed us, not that he ever acted like he would! hahaha

Then came Boulter, mini skirts and white go-go boots. Sonny and Cher were the big hit then right after the Beatles. She was a Paul man, but I was in love with George... sweet timid George. Jo had this long thick dark hair and before school she'd come to my house and would literally iron her hair on the ironing board to get it as straight as we could. We'd head out the door into that humid air and "BOING"! there came the waves and frizz again!. Once I remember

us sitting on the island at the intersection of Van Hwy and 110 to wave at the guys leaving JT. It never occurred to us that this was dangerous. We just wanted to be noticed. By then we could cross Bow street to go to Fauss's for an Icee after school. We'd primp and roll those shorts up at the waist ban after we left the house, decked out with the same white go-go boots and flirt with who ever was the checker of the day. Another quick stop by Lasater's for a walk through to check out the sackers again and then head back home for an hour or two of dancing to the Beatles and Beach Boys. I could go on for about 50 more years but there isn't enough room.

I've headed to the phone for a split second many times the last 2 weeks but I just go to the cemetery and talk to you there. I will always regret I never got to see you for that last goodbye. I don't understand why and I guess I never will. That hurts to the core. Until we can see each other again... I love you friend.
