Lawrence Zillmer, age 92 of Lindale, Texas, passed away Wednesday, December 22, 2021, at his home in Lindale. He was born October 22, 1929, in Barronett, Wisconsin to the late Herman Emil and Florence (Holman) Zillmer. Lawrence received a PHD from the University of Wisconsin and later retired as a college professor from Stephen F. Austin University in Nacogdoches, Texas. After retirement Lawrence served as a pastor for The First Century Christian Fellowship Church in Lindale and was the author of 13 spiritual books. Lawrence had a true servant's heart.

Lawrence is survived by his wife, Iris Zillmer; sons, David Zillmer and Victor Zillmer and wife, Alice; sisters, Clarice Zillmer, Karen Brickman, and Ardith Lester; and numerous other loving family members and friends.
