A Celebration of Life for Lynda McDonald Horn, age 74 of Tyler and previously of Lindale, Texas will be on Tuesday, July 2nd at 1:00pm at CCF (Community Christian Fellowship) in Garden Valley. Lynda McDonald Horn was born on February 23, 1939 and went home to be with her Heavenly Father on Saturday, June 29, 2013. She was born in Tyler, Texas and graduated from Mineola High School in 1957. She lived in Lindale for 40 years and lived in Tyler for the last 5 years. Lynda's love for her family and her Heavenly Father was incredible. Lynda ministered to women in prison, mothered the motherless and led bible studies in her home for years. She was a member of CCF (Community Christian Fellowship) in Garden Valley for 30 plus years. Lynda was a precious woman of faith that will always be treasured.
