Graveside services for Marshall Reed age 87 of Hideaway, Texas were held at 2:30 PM Thursday April 21, 2011 in the Dallas Ft. Worth National Cemetery. Services were under the direction of Caudle-Rutledge Funeral Home of Lindale.

Mr. Reed was born May 18, 1923 in Texarkana, Texas, the son of the late William A. and Sarah (Elliott) Reed. He passed away Monday, April 18, 2011 in a Tyler hospital. Mr. Reed lived in Terrell for 25 years, Canton for 4 years and has lived in Hideaway for the past 4 years. He was a veteran of the U S Army serving in World War II and taking part in the D-Day invasion in Normandy, France. During the Vietnam War, he served as manager of the U S O terminal at Love Field. Mr. Reed was a member of the Methodist faith and the American Legion. He retired from Southwestern Transportation, a division of Southern Pacific Railroad, in 1979.

Mr. Reed is survived by his wife, Nadine Reed of Hideaway; daughters, Marsha Reed Cather and husband Mark of Lewisville, Nancy Reed and husband Kent Wisecarver of Hideaway, Beth Reed Bishop and husband Dennis of Rowlett; 3 grandchildren, Chris Sealey, Blake Bishop, Shelby Bishop and 7 great grandchildren.
