Mrs. VanMeter was born June 22, 1918 to James Edward Wilson and Dora Cook Wilson in Liberty Hill, Louisiana. As the youngest of four children and while still an infant, the Wilson family moved to Dallas, Texas permanently. She was a graduate of Sunset High School and at the age of 18 married George G. VanMeter on September 19, 1936 in Dallas, where the two lived until retiring to their beloved Hide-a-Way Lake, Lindale, Texas in 1971. Maui was a devoted, loving Christian daughter, wife and mother. She not only actively participated in the Cub Scouts serving as den mother, she was a Girl Scout Troup Leader for ten years.
