



Randall "Randy" Cregg Dixon

A memorial service for Randall "Randy" Cregg Dixon, age 93 of Hideaway, Texas, is scheduled for 2:00 p.m. Friday, February 27, 2026, at the Hideaway Community Church in Hideaway, Texas with Pastor Louis Mizell and Rupert Anthony officiating.

Randy passed away on Friday, February 6, 2026, in Grand Saline, Texas at Country Trails Nursing Home. He was born on November 12, 1932, in Cooper, Texas to the late Lee and Odessie Ward Dixon. Randy graduated from Cooper High School in 1950 and joined the Navy in 1951 and served for four years, participating in the Korean War. He then returned to Grand Prairie and joined the police department. He also worked for Allied Finance, several banks, serving as President of three of the banks, including Rose Capital in Tyler. He earned his BBA from Stanton University in 1976. He moved to Hideaway to retire in 1992 and married Betty Kelso in 1995. He enjoyed playing golf with the 9 and 18 hole men's teams, serving as Secretary and Treasurer. He volunteered with Meals on Wheels in Hideaway for several years. Randy loved fishing, gardening, old western movies on TV, traveling and attending Hideaway Community Church. Randy was preceded in death by his sister, Joy Toon of Grand Prairie, Texas.

He is survived by his wife, Betty Dixon of Hideaway; daughters, Robin (Cruz) Garduno of Bellville, Illinois and Amy Dixon and Eric Peterson of Hewitt, Texas; grandsons, Colton Mitchell and Tyler Mitchell of Hewitt, Mateo Garduno of Belville, Illinois; granddaughter, Amber Fikette of Bellville, Illinois;

and his first wife, Twila Dixon, who is the mother of his daughters.
