Our beloved father, Roddy Jack German, of Lindale, Texas went peacefully to his forever home in heaven on April 3, 2024, at the age of 85. Roddy Jack was born in Waco, Texas on January 15, 1939, to Ollie B. German and Mary Florence (Hood) German, both of whom have preceded him in death. He is also preceded in death by his sister, Barbara Ann (German) Edgley, and nephew Ricky Joe Palasota. Roddy Jack grew up in both Waco and Milano, Texas. He was a disabled Veteran who

served his country well in both the United States Navy aboard the USS Bryce Canyon

and the United States Army in the 82nd Airborne Division. He was a retired letter carrier

for the US Postal Service with his final postal route in Rockdale, TX. Roddy Jack was

also an entrepreneur who owned various businesses including a lawn care and

landscaping business in Grand Saline, TX for several years prior to finally deciding to

retire permanently.

Anyone who knew Roddy Jack knew of his love of the Lord, his family, the Dallas

Cowboys, and fishing. He coached his sons' T-ball and little league teams in Cameron,

TX. He also worked with his daughter, Patty, to improve her track skills in high school

and taught his daughter, Tammy, to play chess which was a favorite pastime of his. On

game days, he could be found cheering on his Cowboys whether it be a winning or

losing season. If there wasn't a game on TV, Roddy Jack was probably on the lake

fishing until it got too hard for him to go out on his own.

Roddy Jack also loved music of all kinds, but especially the music of Jim Reeves,

whose songs he would cover quite often as part of the Milano Jamboree back

in the early to mid-seventies. He also wrote songs and poems from time to time. In his retirement years, he enjoyed traveling, photography, playing chess online, watching old westerns, especially John Wayne movies, and fishing. Roddy Jack also loved sitting on his porch with his companion, a German Shepherd named Fritz. The two of them spent many hours on that porch keeping each other company and watching the sun set. Roddy Jack also cherished the times he was able to spend with his children, grand-children, and great grand-children whenever they were able to visit.

A graveside service will be held on Sunday, April 21, 2024, at Liberty Community Cemetery located at 4856 FM 1342, Cameron, TX. A meal and visitation is planned prior to the service at the Liberty Community Church from 12:30-2:00 with the service beginning at 2:00 led by Rev. Gary Westbrook.
