



Roger W. Hallock

March 27, 1921 - February 11, 2003

Roger W. Hallock died on February 11, 2003, in his home in Lindale, Texas. He is survived by his wife of 62 years, Teresa Worrell Hallock, and by his four children; Melanie Kerns of Cassel, California, and her husband, Michael; R. W. "Bill" Hallock, Jr., of Irving, Texas, and his wife Nelda; Steven Hallock and his wife, Cindy Snow, of Lindale, Texas; and Eddie South and his wife, Lahoma, of Oklahoma City. He has ten grandchildren and nine great grandchildren. Born March 27, 1921, in Pittsburgh, Kansas, he spent his early years in Norman, Oklahoma, where his father was pastor of the First Baptist Church for 42 years. He attended the University of Oklahoma and then served in the Army Air Corps during WWII. His structural engineering working career began at Capital Steel & Iron Company in Oklahoma City. He bought H&K Ironworks in 1958, and then after selling it in 1960, moved to Tulsa, Waco, and Fort Worth with other structural steel companies. His favorite job was in Hobbs, New Mexico, with E-Systems, where he was chief engineer for the Very Large Array (VLA) antennas that are now on the St. Augustine Plain in New Mexico. He retired from E-Systems in 1981. He remained active in the business world with his sons, moving to Lindale in 1987, where he has been associated with Benchmark Manufacturing. Combining his love of the Lord with his love of flying, he was active with Wings for Christ, flying doctors and dentists to mission areas in south Texas. He also flew Lay Witness Mission teams to various sites throughout the southeast. He has been a member of the First Baptist Church in Lindale, Texas, for several years. He was an active

deacon at churches in most of the areas where he lived. A celebration service will be held on Saturday, February 15, 2003, at 1:30 p.m. at the First Baptist Church in Lindale, Texas.
