Mr. Snider died Sunday, December 14, 2008. He was born on September 10, 1924 in Hamlin, Texas to Dayton & Esther Jones Snider. Mr. Snider was a veteran of WW II serving in the US Army and was employed by General Dynamics, the Ft. Worth Police Dept., Immigration Dept. in El Paso, and retired from the Dallas Police Dept as a Lieutenant in May of 1974. He also attended Southern Methodist University and Bishop College. Truman was a member of the Mt. Sylvan Masonic Lodge and the Sharon Shrine Temple. He was formerly of Dallas before moving to "The Country Place" in Lindale in 1974, and was a member of the Lindale First United Methodist Church where he founded and volunteered at the "We Care Center", was a member of the Sharon RV Club, and the Ramblin Rose Square Dancing Club.
