Services for Mr. Walter Bower Moyer, age 84, of Hideaway, are scheduled for 10 AM on Thursday, August 27, 2015 at the Hideaway Lake Community Church with Bro. Mr. Moyer died on Monday, August 24, 2015 at the Hospice Homeplace in Tyler. He was born on February 16, 1931 in Franconia, Pennsylvania to Laaden A. and Emma Bower Moyer and was formerly of Bell County, Texas before moving to Hideaway 9 years ago.

Mr. Moyer was a member of the Hideaway Lake Community Church, the Hideaway Men's 9 Hole Golf Group and the Hideaway Scooter Club. He enjoyed playing bridge and forty two, and watching sports on TV, especially the Texas Rangers and Dallas Cowboys games. He loved watching his grandkids play basketball and football and always made time to attend their games as often as possible. He was also an avid fisherman, horseman, loved and owned numerous boats and airplanes, and was a former stock car race driver and pilot, donating many hours piloting for Angel Flight. He also proudly served with the Bell County Sheriff's Posse, of which he was a member for many years. Mr. Moyer owned and operated the Temple Chemical Company in Moody, Texas, retiring in 2001. He was preceded in death by his parents, a sister, Millie Moyer and a son, Richard Watson.

We grew up in barns, with chores and responsibilities. Going on Trail rides and being a part of horse life was a great life and as I have grown older I realize how precious that was. My mom still lives right there so I go by it often. I hate that life let me fall so out of touch and I never got to tell him how much I cherish those memories.
